A true story is told about a Muslim girl who converted to
Christianity and then died at a young age. At her funeral, her
mother asked the missionary, "What did you do to my
daughter?" The startled missionary wasn't quite sure how to answer, and so he replied,
"I did nothing." The mom answered, "Oh yes, you did. She died with a smile on her

By definition, Christians live and die with a calmness and a peace and a strength that the world has no way of giving. They think, speak, act, and react differently than people who have not received the Easter Gospel and taken their stand on it. They don't really fit in. In this sanctuary, we know that the fact that Jesus is alive and well changes everything.

That Jesus rose from the grave proves beyond a reasonable doubt that He was and is who He said he was - Lord of Lords and King of Kings. It proves that all of the written Scriptures are true. It proves that the Father has accepted the sacrifice of His Son as full and complete payment for the sins of the world. It proves that in the courtroom of our God we have been declared not guilty. It proves that funeral homes and caskets



and urns and cemeteries don't get the final word. It proves that our mansions in heaven have been prepared and are on reserve. Christ is risen. He is risen indeed!
