Old Testament Reading: Micah 5:2–5a

- ² But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah,
 - from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel,
 - whose origin is from of old, from ancient days.
- ³ Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has
 - given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return
 - to the people of Israel.
- ⁴ And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD,
 - in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God.
 - And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth.
- ⁵ And he shall be their peace.

Epistle: Hebrews 10:5-10

⁵When Christ came into the world, he said,

- "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired,
 - but a body have you prepared for me;
- ⁶ in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.
- ⁷ Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God,

as it is written of me in the scroll of the book.'"

⁸When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, "Behold, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Holy Gospel: Luke 1:39-45

³⁹In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, 40 and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, ⁴²and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. 45And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."
